"The predominance of the ego, in the human relationships, accounts for the constant frustrations and other unbalances, which mark the human creature.

Without the corresponding lucid conscience in regards to the goals of the carnal existence, the individuals that as such act become the victims of an unhealthy personality to which they have become used to...

(...) Used to the appearance, move away from reality, living insecure in the traps that they have set up with the objective of not allowing to be identified.

Observing the conduct of the reckless people that, sometimes, triumph by means of fantasy and flattery, start to imitate them, letting be led by the absurd behaviours, distant from the reality and from duty.

Inner conflicts are then established, and the scale of values seems to suffer the loss of meaning, the parameters for comprehension disappearing, both of what is correct and of what is wrong.

Once the moments of conviviality in the masquerade balls, to which are reduced their social encounters, are over the identification of the pusillanimity proposes the disrespect for oneself, the loss of self-esteem, the disorder of neurotic behaviour. (...)

It is essential that the self predominates awaken in the individuals, contributing to their fulfilment. security and plenitude.

Although the large majority of people prefer the game of the personalities, it is not possible to ignore the prevalence of suffering that result from it. They deny the truth to themselves, they refuse the self encounter, they flee the awakening of the values that lie dormant, and succumb."

Daniel Goleman, in *Emotional Intelligence*, states that the great spiritual masters, like Jesus and Buddha, "have touched the heart of their disciples by speaking in the language of emotion..."

But what is emotion? The Aurélio dictionary refers to it as "action of moving (morally); disturbance or variation of the spirit derived from diverse situations, and that is manifested as joy, sadness, anger etc..." According to Goleman, "emotion refers to a feeling and its distinct thoughts, psychological and biological states and to a range of tendencies to act."

Emotions are manifested in different ways, negative or positive, the basic ones being:

ANGER: fury, revolt, resentment, rage, exasperation, animosity, irritability, hostility and, perhaps in the extreme, pathological hatred and violence.

SADNESS: suffering, sorrow, discouragement, loneliness, self-pity, despair and, when pathological, severe depression.

FEAR: anxiety, apprehension, nervousness, preoccupation, caution, unrest, fright, scare, horror and, as psychopathology, phobia and panic.

PLEASURE: happiness, joy, contentment, delight, pride, gratification, satisfaction, good humour, disposition and enthusiasm, euphoria, ecstasy and, in the extreme, mania.

LOVE: acceptance, friendship, trust, affinity, dedication, devotion, charity.

The psychoemotional health, being a result of the balance in thinking, feeling and behaving, stimulates us to self-healing, through the self-discovery, self-knowledge and the self-transformation.

Developing exercises of interiorization, meditation and reflexion, facilitates the self-perception, enabling the learning of the psychoemotional management and leading the beings to make healthier choices before their consciences, well-balancing them.

Allan Kardec in *The Gospel According to Spiritism*, has precisely established that the "unshakeable faith is only the one that can face reason, in all human epochs". When including reason as the instance for the building up of faith, not meaning that it is exclusively intellectual, Spiritism teaches us to experience faith in a conscious way. And if faith, experienced is this deep form, lead us to face the collective history with lucidity, it must also lead us to the harmonization of our individual history, before all and any circumstan-

to the faith or security that we feel in ourselves, being a factor of great importance for the personal development. When it is impaired, it makes us notice the qualities that we have, handing in ourselves to the limitations that have been developed by ourselves. When it is excessive, it leads to the distorted perception of ourselves, making us see values and qualities that do not exist. When it is just right, along with faith and confidence, it will be able to activate, in our journey, the required transpersonal energies in order to let us finally reach the existential plenitude.
